The California Transparency in Supply Chains Act requires companies to disclose efforts to eliminate slavery and human trafficking in supply chains. As a socially responsible, publicly traded company, Metallus Corporation and its employees are required to comply with all applicable laws, rules and regulations in the jurisdictions in which we conduct our business, including laws related to the prohibition of human trafficking and slave labor.

Metallus has an active and robust ethics and compliance program and is committed to the highest standards for lawful, honest, and ethical conduct in all business dealings.
